Surf Internet is Here!

As Surf Internet is installing fiberoptic in our community, please be mindful of the Julie locates Flags (and make sure they stay in place) to ensure safety of all contractors and uninterrupted services to your residence and others. This is a great



opportunity to take note of where all the utility lines (electrical, water, sewer, gas) are located on your property. And if you decide to dig anywhere on your property, be sure to call JULIE first! This ensures all utilities are marked in the areas you plan to dig.

Friendly Reminder: Please avoid planting in the road easement (33 feet from the center of the road). If LLUD needs to dig in this area to repair water or sewer lines, any plants located there may need to be removed. While we do our best to minimize disruption, LLUD is not responsible for replacing plantings in the easement—this remains the homeowner's responsibility.



Recently, LLUD had difficulty accessing a water valve because a bush planted many years ago grew around the water valve. When planning your landscaping, please keep in mind how large trees or shrubs may grow over time. Be sure to leave enough clearance around utility equipment so that access remains safe and hassle-free in the future.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades

Upgrades to our Wastewater Treatment Plant for Lost Lake Utility District in Dixon, Illinois were financed by the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF). The SRF program is administered by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and receives a portion of its money to fund these types of projects from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. This project includes improvements to the existing wastewater treatment plant replacing cell number 2 of the recirculating sand filter. Once complete, it will improve the effluent quality of the treatment plant and improve the plant's longevity. SRF programs operate in each state to provide communities with the resources necessary to build, maintain, and improve the infrastructure that protects one of our most valuable resources: water.
